

Chance to Shine Safeguarding Referral Request

As a charity that gives children and young people the opportunity to play, learn and develop through cricket, at Chance to Shine (CTS) we are committed to our duty to ensure all those participating in CTS programmes are kept safe.

Following a recent review of our internal governance around safeguarding, the CTS Board have appointed Dana Abdulkarim as the nominated Trustee to lead the safeguarding agenda at Board level. Safeguarding at Board level is the responsibility of all Trustees at CTS and monitoring is delegated to the Audit and Risk Committee.

Furthermore, CTS has appointed an additional Designated Safeguarding Officer, with Emma Palmer (Diversity and Inclusion Manager) supporting James Hendry (Operations Manager) with day-to-day responsibilities for safeguarding within the CTS Team.

As our programmes are delivered by external delivery partners and their coaches, it's important that we are made aware of any incidents relating to CTS programmes in a timely manner. Having reviewed the current process with the ECB Safeguarding Team we require **all ECB Incident Report Forms submitted by County Boards relating to CTS programmes** to be shared with CTS at the same time they are shared with the ECB Safeguarding Team. The ECB Safeguarding Team will remain responsible for any necessary investigations, and engagement with the CTS Safeguarding Team will take place if and when required.
